





1880-1955

This was the dominant architectural style during the early part of the 20th century. There are many subtypes contained within this style. For example, those homes with a gambrel roof are commonly referred to as Dutch Colonial Revival. Typical identifying features include:

- Accentuated front door with decorative crown (pediment) supported by pilasters or columns.
- Doors commonly have overhead fanlights and/or sidelights.
- Façade is usually symmetrical.
- Windows are usually double hung with multi-pane glazing.


