
1890-1940

This style is based on a variety of Medieval English architecture that ranges from the thatch-roof cottage to the grand manor house. Although present in the United States during the late 19th century, the Tudor Revival style exploded in popularity during the 1920s and 1930s.

- Steeply pitched roof.
- Decorative half-timbering.
- Tall, narrow windows, usually with multiple pane glazing.
- Massive chimneys commonly crowned with chimney pots.
- Walls are commonly stucco, brick, stone or wood.




















TODOR REVIVAL
